

Why do the nations rage, and the people plot in vain?

The kings of the earth take their stand, and the rulers conspire together against the Lord and his Anointed One. "Let us break their bonds," they cry, "and cast their chords from us."

The one who sits in heaven merely laughs; the Lord scoffs at them.

Psalm 2:1-4

If a poll posed the question: "Who do you think was the best president that the United States has ever had?" Not many people would name David Atchison. Atchison was our country's president in 1849 . . . for one day. The term of James Polk expired at noon on March 4th of that year. His successor, Zachary Taylor, refused to take the oath of office on March 4th because it fell on a Sunday, and he did not think it appropriate to dishonor the Lord's Day with politics. Polk's vice president had resigned days earlier, and so, David Rice Atchison, president pro tempore of the Senate, was authorized to exercise the powers of the presidency on that day by virtue of being third in the line of succession.

Atchison's colleagues jokingly lobbied for cabinet appointments and grand policy initiatives, but not much happened on that day. How did President Atchison spend his time in power? He took a nap. In an interview with the St Louis Globe, he explained: "There had been two or three busy nights finishing up the work of the Senate, and I slept most of that Sunday." Some might argue that Atchison was one of our better presidents. After all, he did accomplish the first of John Wesley's general rules: Do no harm. Furthermore, he and President-elect Taylor demonstrated confidence that the welfare of the nation could be entrusted to the Lord. At least for one day.

As I write this, our country is embroiled in another contentious election. "The other side is going to destroy our way of life!" the partisans howl. "This is the most important election in history!!" both sides cry together. The psalmist asks why the nations rage. The query invites deeper consideration: Why do the people of God rage? Why do Christians today rage? Why do we contribute our voices and resources to the frenzied plots of the faithless? Why do we allow our hearts to be frightened and our minds distressed by the impotent conspiracies of would-be kings? Do we not believe the one who sits in heaven remains firmly in control? Have we lost faith that his Anointed One is the King of all kings and the Ruler of all rulers?

Of course, Christians should be concerned about the policies and practices of earthly governments. These things impact not only our own interests but those of the people--friends and enemies alike--that our Lord calls us to love and serve. But that concern must come with a calm assurance; an assurance born of confidence that a greater power, a crucified Kingdom, is peacefully demolishing the vainglorious kingdoms of the world. Given the heightened emotions and hyperbolic rhetoric we are enduring, I thought this would be a good time to remind the church of some more of Wesley's wisdom. The October 6, 1774 entry of his journal says:

I met those of our society who had votes in the ensuing election and advised them: 1) to vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy; 2) to speak no evil of the person they voted against, and 3) to take care that their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side.

This is good, godly advice for Methodists and all people—as timely today as it was in Wesley's day. To the degree that we follow these words of wisdom, we will spare ourselves much anger and anxiety, minister cooling peace in an overheated political climate, and bear witness to God's Spirit within us.



Why is Prayer Important?

Pray for our leaders

The lips of a king speak as an oracle, and his mouth does not betray justice.

Honest scales and balances belong to the Lord; all the weights in the bag are of his making.

Kings detest wrongdoing,

for a throne is established through righteousness.

Kings take pleasure in honest lips;

they value the one who speaks what is right.

A king's wrath is a messenger of death,

but the wise will appease it.

When a king's face brightens, it means life;

his favor is like a rain cloud in spring. Proverbs 16:10-15

The highway of the upright avoids evil;

Those who guard their ways will preserve their lives.

Pride goes before destruction,

A haughty spirit before a fall. Proverbs 16:17,18

I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all people. This has now been witnessed to at the proper time. 1 Timothy 2:1-6

As we approach Election Day in 7 weeks we are a divided people throughout the country and even in our churches. Some have very strong feelings toward one candidate or the other. Many are in despair thinking the situation is impossible to resolve. But we serve a God of the impossible who hears our hearts and answers our prayer. No matter which candidate is our choice let us as Christians unite in praying for God to raise up the candidate of His choice to lead this nation in right-eousness. We know it is God's desire for us to have godly leadership. Proverbs points out the characteristics of a good leader. In Paul's letter to Timothy he encourages us to pray for our leaders. Let us pray together this will be the time for His desire and will to be revealed. As the Israelites waited for their savior, and ours, let us wait and pray now in unity, faith, hope and trust for God's will in the upcoming election..

Almighty God of the impossible, Holy King of all the earth, we are in despair and grief for our divided nation. Regardless of our personal opinions and choices lead us to unite in prayer, faith and trust for You to raise up a team of Your choice and convict them of and endow them with the qualities of a good leader with a righteous heart of justice and honesty. Overcome pride and haughty spirits with Your Holy Spirit's power of love, wisdom and compassion. Fill them and guide them with a sense of responsibility to You and to us, standing against the perverse and violent schemes prevalent in our country today. Fill them with a humble spirit recognizing that You alone are God and You reign today as always – even over those in authority. We pray in faith, hope and trust, to You, Holy and Supreme God, in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Amen.

This is an all time fantastic outreach to the community. We gather together and offer a "Safe Place" for the children to "Trick or Treat." Bring your car/truck or even just a chair or table.

Decorate it with non-gory items. No ghosts, no witches, no vampires or bloody daggers, etc. Just some fun stuff. Bible story themes are great. You may collect certain items (bears, dolls, mugs, etc.). Or you may just put a container of flowers in your trunk - that works too!!!

Beginning in October there will be pictures in the vestibule of past trunks. It would be ideal if we have at least 25 trunks! To make it even easier for you to consider signing up, on that evening, arrive around 4:30 PM. Set up your display, then join us in the social hall at 5 PM for a light supper- you don't have to cook!!!

We ask that each trunk provide candy or treats (ex. pencils, pretzels, chips, popcorn) for at least 100. Food items must be individually wrapped.

Soup for the Soul

Soup for the Soul has been serving between 35 and 50 people per week. The teams who serve are grateful for your support and they would like to ask for your continued support in the Soup and Dessert areas. They need three soups per week and a variety of desserts. There is a sign up sheet in the narthex. If you have questions, please contact Dale Kehrer, coordinator of the program.

Conley's Pantry

We were blessed, for many months, as we received many staple food products from the Food Bank of Delaware through the New Covenant Presbyterian Church. Due to changes in the structure of the Food Bank program, they are no longer able to provide us with extra food. We will continue to receive food from the Lewes Farmer's Market program through mid-December. Our biggest needs are Spam or similar canned meat, Vienna Sausages in the little cans, spaghetti sauce, cans or pouches of Beef Stew, and jelly. We do not need pasta, peanut butter, tuna fish, mac and cheese. Please do not bring things like cake mix, pancake mix and jello.

Feeding the Flock

We have continued to serve about 200 lunches each Monday, as well as helping with meals at Higher Ground Outreach, the Siesta 2 motel and the Tokyo tent encampment. In addition to our lunches, we have been providing food boxes with staples to several families. We have also been helping with clothes for some of our lunch people. We are so thankful to the Thrift Store for providing clothes and helping with furniture needs. Your support for our program is much appreciated. The donations of food, finances and help keep our ministry running smoothly.

Help Needed

At the end of September, I will be stepping down as the overseer of the Panera Bread ministry. Mae and Jim Truman will also be stepping down from this ministry as of the end of September. They have put their house on the market and are planning to move. They have served faithfully for a number of years. This ministry involves picking up Panera Bread on Monday mornings and picking up from the Wawa on Rt 24 in Long Neck; packaging up what you have received and delivering it to several locations. September has been a busy month here at the Thrift Shop. Robinsonville Road was finally opened on our side of Route 24 and we have seen an increase in our day to day traffic. Our regular customers are just bubbling over with enthusiasm about being able to get to the shop without all of the detours.

The Morris Farm in Laurel, De. has brought fresh vegetables to the shop on Tuesdays and Fridays and sometimes extra drop offs between times because of the demands. Our local customers have spread the word and we have guests waiting on them to do the setups. Last Friday was our last day for the veggies this season. Thanks Charlie and Diane. It was nice visiting with you this summer and we look forward to hosting the veggies again next summer.

On Monday September 16 th we did the clothing change over. Thanks to all of the volunteers and our 2 guys for making it a productive and enjoyable time. This was the easiest changeover that we have ever done. The ladies removed all of the hanging clothing from the kids, women's and men's rooms and bagged them for donation to Phoenix Clothing Company in Newark (they have a major free clothing distribution). They then did a deep clean of the rooms and then rehung about 30+ large tubs of fall and winter clothing. We also did the same with shoes and purses. Sales have been strong and everyone is excited to add to their wardrobe. The Thrift Shop treated everyone to a nice lunch and desert.

On September 19 th , I represented Conley's Church at the ribbon cutting of What is Your Voice (Pearl House) to the opening of their 3rd safe shelter home. What an amazing job that they have done and continue to do. It all started with a DREAM and a piece of land. This house is a new build that will accommodate 4 mothers and their children. What is Your Voice has recognized the people who have helped furnish this home with nice plaques that are displayed in prominent locations in the home. It was wonderful to see Conley's Thrift Shop mentioned in numerous locations.


Conley's Thrift Shop has had the opportunity to help several people in need with clothing and furniture during September. What a blessing it is to see the smiles of those we help.





The NFL made a package flight deal for Green Bay Packers fans and Philadelphia Eagles fans - they played their contest in Brazil, the first NFL game ever in South America. Two separate flights were chartered – one from Philadelphia, the other from Chicago. However, Packer's fan Marie went with the Eagles group because her daughter is an Eagles fan - and that flight leaves from Philly which is obviously clos-

er than Chicago. The NFL treated both groups like royalty - for example they did not have to buy a single meal. Parties, open bars, buffets, etc. were provided for all their dietary needs. The two had a ball in Sao Paulo, and me? I was delighted to stay at home. I played 18 holes of golf at Plantation Lakes golf club with my brother John, shooting a 92. Just an FYI, I paid for Marie's whole trip.

"AND YOU THINK YOU GOT IT BAD! JUST FOR SINGIN'!"

"Before five the mob surrounded the house again in greater numbers than ever. The cry of one and all was "Bring out the minister, we will have the minister."

"I desired one to take their captain by the hand and bring him into the house. After a few sentences interchanged between us, the lion became a lamb. I desired him to go and bring one or two more of the most angry of his companions. He brought in two who were ready to swallow the ground with rage, but in two minutes they were as calm as he. I then bade them make way that I might go out among the people.

"As soon as I was in the midst of them, I called for a chair, and standing up, asked, "What do any of you want with me? Some said, "We want you to go with us to the justice." I replied, "That I will, with all my heart." I then spoke a few words, which God applied, so that they cried out with might and main, "The gentleman is an honest gentleman, and we will spill our blood in his defense." I asked, "Shall we go to the justice tonight, or in the morning? Most of them cried, "Tonight, tonight", on which I went before, and two or three hundred followed, the rest returning whence they came.

"The night came on before we had walked a mile, together with heavy rain. However, on we went to Bentley Hall, two miles from Wednesbury. One or two ran before to tell Mr. Lane they had brought Mr. Wesley before his worship. Mr. Lane replied, "What have I to do with Mr. Wesley? Go and carry him back again." By this time the main body came up and began knocking at the door. A servant told them Mr. Lane was in bed. His son followed and asked what was the matter. One replied, "Why, an't please you, they sing psalms all day, nay, and make folks rise at five in the morning. And what would your worship advise us to do?"

"To go home." said Mr. Lane, "and be quiet."



MORTGAGE BURNING CELEBRATION!!!

What a joy this will be! Brothers and sisters, we are so close. At the end of this year, we will be down to about \$8,000. We would love, with your help, to be able to have it paid by the end of December, in order to have a mortgage burning celebration in January!

God has certainly blessed us over the years!! We built our parsonage in 2004/2005 for about \$166,000 debt-free. The pavilion was also built debt-free for \$31,000. Then came our current campus. We received pledges, did many fundraisers, and built the shell debt-free for about \$732,000. Then to finish the building, we had to step out in faith and obtain a mortgage trusting God for the funds, and God has certainly given us the funds.

We started 3/29/2010 with a mortgage of \$1,250,000.00 and in just 14 years, we are near completion. In addition to money received for the building, our members also gave money for Bibles, appliances, the steeple, candles, altar cross, offering plates, paraments, the sign on Rt. 24, and we even had a square foot club.

Thanks to the many donations we received, fundraisers, and payments from the Thrift Shop, the mortgage burning celebration will SOON be a reality.
